CASE STUDY: Renowned documentary filmmaker Ken Burns wanted to construct a classic 19th century New England barn to house a screening studio and guest quarters on his New Hampshire property. He retained Bensonwood Homes to replicate a building hundreds of years old that meets contemporary needs. Originally, Burns had planned to move and renovate an existing barn but the structure wouldn't have met modern building codes.

"I'm in the business of history, of trying to make the past come alive," said the creator of "The Civil War" and other heralded documentary films. "I've been able to translate that passion into a tangible, physical building that feels old and realize a life-long dream."

Vermont Natural Coatings PolyWhey® exterior was used to coat the exterior vertical siding milled from local hemlock. PolyWhey also was used on the timbers of the 30 x 48-foot, two story barn.
